



Peter Stonefield, BSAE '89 (University of Kansas), MBA '02 (Pepperdine University), started his career in 1989 working on the Space Shuttle fleet in Quality and then Main Propulsion System Engineering at Kennedy Space Center, Florida. During his tenure there he developed several integral engineering and inspection procedures used to reduce shuttle turn-around-time until the retirement of the fleet in 2001.

After supporting NASA, Mr. Stonefield worked as a senior engineer at Trans World Airlines and then with other FAA Repair Stations where he also worked on business development and marketing. He was responsible for opening the (Mainland) Chinese market for several companies and his was one of the first companies to begin repair development activities there.

In July of 2007, Mr. Stonefield developed and created Asia-Pacific Engineering Consulting Services, LLC (APECS) for the expressed purpose of using his extensive experience in aviation repair development, regulatory support, modification management, and aviation business development & marketing. As an FAA Designated Engineering Representative (FAA-DER) he is authorized by the FAA to develop and approve major repairs and alterations on a wide-range of platforms including commercial and military aircraft, helicopters and UAS. His hands-on experience also includes working with both manned and unmanned types of space vehicles.

Mr. Stonefield has worked extensively with the US military in many capacities and as a businessman has long supported our military men and women through fund-raising and other philanthropic efforts including the sponsorship of Military Appreciation Night for the South Carolina Stingrays (ECHL) Hockey club. He is also the Executive Director for the Hershel "Woody" Williams Medal of Honor Foundation responsible for placing a Gold Star Families Memorial Monument at Patriots Point in South Carolina, which was dedicated 27 January 2018.
